## Pine Needle Scale Outbreak

You may have noticed the recent outbreak of scale on many of the pine trees in the neighborhood. The Association is looking into treating our infested trees in the early spring of next year. Pine needle scales produce two generations each year. Eggs hatch in late May through early June, and again in late July through August; emerging over a two week period. Crawlers move to mature needles and begin feeding, forming new armor. In three to five weeks adults emerge; males as winged adults and females as wingless. Once mating is complete, females grow for two more weeks and lay eggs underneath their armor. Eggs overwinter under the armor and emerge the following year to begin feeding. In areas where there is one generation per year, scales mature by the end of summer and lay overwintering eggs.
